



OU General Fund Revenue Resources 1972-2018





- Largest FY 2019 percent increase, 3.1%, in state funding versus to 2% overall increase
- Major Lame Duck Issues
 - \$30M in state capital outlay support for the renovation of South Foundation Hall
 - Lobbied to protect Oakland
 University's existing liquor licenses
 - Successfully lobbied to prevent approval of teacher preparation bills opposed by Schools of Education



Fall Enrollment (excluding pre-nursing)


