


### PUTTING IT IN WRITING


The inaugural Rosen Fellowship for Undergraduate Writers and Their Supervising Faculty – made possible by the Joan Rosen Endowment and coordinated by [The Writing Center](#) – has provided eight undergraduate students and supporting faculty members with \$1,000 grants to pursue mentored research projects. Such projects are typically reserved for graduate level work.

Our undergraduates have taken advantage of these opportunities to explore topics in archaeology, psychology and the arts, to name just a few fields of interest. Upon completion of their projects, grant recipients will be encouraged to share their findings by publishing in academic journals and presenting at conferences.+

I should also note that the Joan Rosen Endowment helps fund general Writing Center operations, which have provided comprehensive writing support to all OU students for more than a decade. 
OU redshirt senior volleyball player **Sammy Condon** is just such a person. She is one of only 30 NCAA women student-athletes from across the country to be named as candidates for the Senior CLASS Award in collegiate volleyball. Prospective honorees are selected based on notable achievements in the areas of community, classroom, character and competition.

Condon is only the second player in the NCAA Division I era to earn first team all-league honors in three consecutive seasons. An elementary education major, she also maintains a 3.75 grade-point average. Kudos to Sammy for all of her outstanding work!
