Minutes of the Meeting of the Oakland University Board of Trustees **Audit Committee Meeting** April 2, 2020

A. Call to Order

Chair Melissa Stolicker called the meeting to order at 11:10 a.m. via WebEx.

B. New Items for Consideration

1. Approval of Minutes of the Audit Committee Meeting of October 14, 2019

Trustee Stolicker seconded by Trustee Fey moved approval of the Minutes of the Audit Committee Meeting of October 14, 2019 and the motion was unanimously approved by those present.

2. Reappointment of an Independent Public Accounting Firm and Audit Scope

Mr. Beaghan framed the two topics presented for Audit Committee approval, that of the reappointment of Plante Moran as the University's external auditor, and FY2020 Financial Statement audit scope. Mr. Beaghan then introduced Dana Coomes and Stephen Bondar of Plante Moran to present the FY2020 Financial Statement audit scope.

Ms. Coomes began by affirming that this communication is required prior to the start of the audit, planned to commence in the May-June timeframe. Ms. Coomes reported no significant changes in scope or timing of the audit from last year. Regarding GASB 84 and its proposed adoption by the University during this fiscal year, GASB announced that it added a project to consider posting new GASB pronouncements, which would include GASB 84. The exposure draft is expected to be issued in April 2020 and a final version to be issued in May 2020. This may indicate that GASB 84 will be delayed and therefore not implemented by the University this year.

Mr. Bondar, the Plante Moran audit manager for the Oakland University audit, outlined the contents of pre-audit communication letter. The letter describes various qualitative aspects of the audit, including responsibilities under auditing standards. It includes the plan, scope and timing of the audit and other relevant information for governance. As an attachment to the letter, a description of some of the more significant areas of the audit and the planned approach to address those sections. Mr. Bondar noted that if GASB 84 implementation is not delayed, the audit opinion would include an Emphasis of Matter paragraph relative to the adoption of that standard.

In response to a question from Trustee Stolicker, Ms. Coomes advised that a GASB project to scope out the 403(b) plans or 401k plans was expected to be issued April - May 2020. However, this may be postponed. Ms. Coomes believes that when the University adopts the new GASB 84, it will not include the 403(b) plans.

In response to a question from Trustee Stolicker regarding logistics and alternatives to onsite audit work, Ms. Coomes advised that University capabilities should enable roughly 95% of the work to be completed remotely. VPN, University systems access, and an established SharePoint site will be utilized to promote minimal impact on efficiency. Work completed regarding student financial aid and the security of certain personal information like social security numbers is considered.

Ms. Coomes confirmed this year as Plante Moran's 4th year of engagement with the University, and the historical relationship will provide benefit as they move forward planning and executing this year's audit.

Trustee Stolicker seconded by Trustee Fey moved approval to accept reappointment of the Independent Public Accounting Firm and Audit Scope, Plante Moran, and the motion was unanimously approved by those present.

C. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned into closed session at 11:25 a.m.
