Bachelor of Science – Interdisciplinary Healthcare Studies

Dr. Britt Rios-Ellis, Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, presented the Bachelor of Science – Interdisciplinary Healthcare Studies recommendation as set forth in the agendum item.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees authorizes the School of Health Sciences to offer an interdisciplinary healthcare studies degree program; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost will complete annual reviews of the interdisciplinary healthcare studies degree program to evaluate academic quality and fiscal viability to determine whether the program should continue.

Provost Rios-Ellis called on Dr. Kevin A. Ball, Dean, School of Health Sciences; Dr. Christina Papadimitriou, Proposal Coordinator and Associate Professor, Health Sciences; and Dr. Amanda Lynch, Department of Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Chairperson and Associate Professor, Health Sciences, to give a brief overview and PowerPoint presentation of the Bachelor of Science – Interdisciplinary Healthcare Studies program.

After discussion, Trustee Stolicker, seconded by Trustee Tull, moved approval of the recommendation, and the motion was unanimously approved by those present.

Approval for Purchase of 1500 University Drive, Auburn Hills

Provost Rios-Ellis and Mr. James L. Hargett, Interim Vice President for Finance and Administration, presented the Approval for Purchase of 1500 University Drive, Auburn Hills recommendation as set forth in the agendum item.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees (Board) authorizes the Interim Vice President for Finance and Administration to execute a purchase and sale agreement with JMF2, LLC, to purchase 1500 University Drive, Auburn Hills (Property) for \$8,150,000; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees approves the 1500 University Drive Renovation Project at a not to exceed cost of \$8 million; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board waives the Board Policy requirement that the Property be evaluated by three qualified appraisers; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board authorizes the President, Interim Vice President for Finance and Administration, and their respective designees, to perform all acts and deeds and to execute and deliver all contracts, instruments, and documents required by this resolution that are necessary, expedient, and proper in connection with the purchase of the Property; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that said purchase and sale agreement, contracts, instruments and documents shall be reviewed by, and be in a form acceptable to, the Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel prior to execution, and be in compliance with the law and University policies and regulations, as well as conform to the legal standards of the Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel.

Trustee Schostak stated that he had walked through the Property and he believed it was an incredible opportunity. He acknowledged that the pricing was not anywhere near what it would cost to build the building on our campus. He further elaborated that we needed to make sure the building met the highest standards for our students and faculty. First, he believes the Trustees should be approving the complete renovation to the building on the Property and not postpone such a decision. Second, the building is dated and needs work and the work should be done up front so that we have a building we are proud of. And third, costs are going up. As such, we need to move on the Project. He further stated that he believes the number the Board should approve \$25,000,000 for the purchase of the Property and renovation (including contingency) of the building.

A discussion of the recommendation followed.

Trustee Stolicker asked if the first \$8,000,000 needed to be incurred prior to the building being ready to occupy? Interim Vice President Hargett answered that there are pieces and parts we could use, but a lot of that is IT upgrades, classroom support upgrades that are absolutely needed, some is health and safety, fire suppression that we absolutely need, but there are probably pieces of that we could go without, but the way we presented it we wanted this done. Provost Rios-Ellis noted, we are short on classrooms so 10 of the classrooms will have to be used.

Trustee Tull agreed with Trustee Schostak and moved that the Board approve the recommendation with an amount not to exceed \$25,000,000 for the purchase of the Property and renovation (including contingency) of the building. Trustee Tull added that he thought we need to realistically look at what the costs are going to be by the time this particular investment is made and done. He considers the Property an investment. He agreed that it is cheaper to do things the first time right than to have the water torture test over an extended period of time.

Trustee Stolicker seconded Trustee Tull's motion.

Following a brief discussion, the Board unanimously approved Trustee Tull's motion and the following amended recommendation:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees (Board) authorizes the Interim Vice President for Finance and Administration to execute a purchase and sale agreement with JMF2, LLC, to purchase 1500 University Drive, Auburn Hills (Property) for \$8,150,000; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees approves the 1500 University Drive Renovation Project at a not to exceed cost of \$16.85 million; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board waives the Board Policy requirement that the Property be evaluated by three qualified appraisers; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board authorizes the President, Interim Vice President for Finance and Administration, and their respective designees, to perform all acts and deeds and to execute and deliver all contracts, instruments, and documents required by this resolution that are necessary, expedient, and proper in connection with the purchase of the Property; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that said purchase and sale agreement, contracts, instruments and documents shall be reviewed by, and be in a form acceptable to, the Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel prior to execution, and be in compliance with the law and University policies and regulations, as well as conform to the legal standards of the Vice President for Legal Affairs and General Counsel.
