APPROVAL OF HONORARY DEGREE FOR MICHAEL TRESE A Recommendation

- **1.** <u>Division and Department</u>: Academic Affairs, Office of the Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost.
- 2. <u>Introduction</u>: In accordance with Article IX of the Bylaws of the Board of Trustees, honorary degrees may be awarded by the Board of Trustees in recognition of distinguished accomplishment and service within the scope of the arts and letters, sciences, professions, and public service as recognized and supported by the University. The awarding of honorary degrees reaffirms Oakland University's scholarly, creative, and humanitarian values and ties the University to the community at large.
- Dr. Michael Trese was unanimously the committee's top choice for this honor. His career is beyond impressive and his long-standing involvement with Oakland University is truly awe-inspiring.

Dr. Trese is currently considered by many to be the father of modern pediatric vitreoretinal surgery. His nominators note: "Dr. Trese refined his surgical techniques, which have now become the standard operating procedure for pediatric retinal surgery. Over the past few decades, Dr. Trese has taught his techniques to hundreds of pediatric surgeons worldwide, resulting in the saving of sight for thousands of affected infants. Before Dr. Trese's revolutionary surgical procedures, children with severe pediatric eye disease had little or no hope of regaining sight."

His impressive career has resulted in over 300 published articles and numerous awards including the Laureate Recognition Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology in 2021. He also founded a nonprofit foundation known as the Pediatric Retinal Research Foundation (PRRF), a not-for-profit foundation dedicated to funding clinically-relevant basic science and clinical research to eliminate retinopathy of prematurity and associated retinal diseases. The PRRF website https://www.pediatricn-f.org/ serves as an international resource for families of children with pediatric eye disease.

Dr. Trese's involvement with Oakland University began in 1982. It is not an understatement to say that he has been a critical component of the success of the Eye Research Institute. Dr. Trese recently passed away, so this would be awarded posthumously.
