The 5000 level courses will fulfill the 6000 level MBA elective requirements. Note 5:

MIS 6900 - ST: IOT And Cloud Computing (CRN 14030): This course explores the latest in technologies and topics of the Cloud and Internet of Things (IoT). We will cover the primary pillars of the Cloud: storage, compute, networking, security, databases and IoT. In addition, to the technologies we will explore other topics that individuals will see in practice like: migration, governance, TCO/ROI and management. The students will spend time reading and researching areas of the Cloud and working on a project that showcases the areas. This course will provide an overview of Amazon Web Services (AWS) technologies: S3, EC2, IAM, VPC, RDS, KMS, Lambda, DynamoDB, Simple Notification Service, IoT and others. The students will build a solution using an IoT Button leveraging several AWS Services

Note 6:

MIS 6900 - ST: Business Application Tech (CRN 11528): As the Web becomes a standard platform for enterprise computing and e-commerce, most of the business applications developed nowadays are web-based. Web application development is steadily becoming more complex. There is a great need for separating the content from the page design so that content could be modified without changing the layout. Server-side technologies (such as Servlets and JSP) facilitate web applications to be broken down into separate components, which allow different groups to work on different aspects of the application. For example, one group could focus on design of the layout, "look-and-feel" etc. while another group may concentrate on just the content. This course focuses on the fundamentals of web applications as well as the programming technologies and techniques to build them.
