*Wayne Law requires a minimum of 75 undergraduate credits for admission. Acceptance is done holistically relying heavily on LSAT and undergraduate GPA. Once admitted and the first year of law school successfully completed, student transfer their Wayne Law courses (30 credits) back to OU toward fulfillment of their BS degree.
