



Excellence in Service Award

- I. Eligibility** - All faculty who are tenured, tenure-track, or have a standard faculty appointment in the Oakland University William Beaumont School of Medicine are eligible.*
- II. Criteria** - This award recognizes exemplary service by a faculty member through leadership, development, and dedication to institutional and community engagement activities central to the mission of the School of Medicine.

Elements for assessing excellence include:

- a. Imaginative or innovative approaches to service
- b. Evidence that the service leads to positive, meaningful outcomes
- c. Evidence of the importance and impact of the service on OUWB or the community such as:
 - i. Creating and coordinating high-quality community partnerships
 - ii. Cultivating other leaders and advocates on campus
 - iii. Developing a strong, sustainable service project
 - iv. Attaining funding or grants to support the service
 - v. Presentations at local, regional, national, and/or international society meetings.
 - vi. Publication in peer-reviewed journals.
 - vii. Recognition of service through media, testimonials, or awards given by the institution, professional society, community, or other
- d. Serving as a community service model to our students
- e. Incorporating valuable critical thinking and effective reflection on community service
- f. Nominee must exhibit high standards of professionalism.

- III. Evaluation** - The Faculty Recognition Committee will evaluate the nominees' materials according to the criteria listed above.
