



- Faculty and Staff Engagement: Implementation of Employee Resource Network FAQ section







NEW! The 1929 Club

- Members donate \$19.29 each month to support the care and preservation of the estate and collection.
- 100+ members including 39 firsttime donors
- Pledges totaling more than \$45,000!



IMLS Preservation Grant

- \$500,000
- Saving America's Treasures grant from the Institute of Museum and Library
- Services to restore and improve windows throughout the estate



NEW! 1% Preservation Fee

- January 2025, 1% fee on all facility rentals that will go toward MBH preservation needs.
- Based on current Facility Rental revenue of \$4.1 million, we anticipate the fee will generate \$40,000 annually.

A National Historic Landmark, Meadow Brook Hall is a historic house museum, cultural center and events and wedding venue. Built in 1929 by Oakland University founder Matilda Dodge Wilson, Meadow Brook represents one of the finest examples of Tudor-revival style architecture in America, and is especially renowned for its superb craftsmanship, remarkable grounds and grand scale.



110-room mansion is sure to delight visitors.


Elevated Meadow Brook Website

- Launched August 2024
- Website features elevated mobile-friendly design, updated messaging, streamlined navigation, and beautiful image galleries.
- Website traffic has increased more than 12% year over year (from 2023 to 2024) and 210% since 2020.



The Holidays at Meadow Brook

- Holiday revenue has increased nearly 9% from 2021 to 2024.
- In 2024, expanded the Winter Wonder Lights tour route and added two allnew original light feature attractions.
- Meadow Brook Hall earned second place in USA Today's National 2024 10 Best Readers' Choice travel awards!



Touring & Visitation

- Steep growth trajectory for several years.
- Visitation from tours, programs and facility rental events have increased 38% since 2019.
- Revenue increased from \$3.5 million in 2021 to \$5.1 million in 2024.

- Philanthropic campaign raised more than \$2 million


Restoring the Pegasus Fountain

Next Project: Timber Restoration

Urgent need to address a number of building condition and water infiltration issues.

Requires assessing the timber condition to determine areas with a worsened condition and new condition of degradation.

Timbers are essential for structural support, and are significant to achieving the National Historic Landmark designation.
