



- Keynote Speaker: Angela T. Moore, an OU alumna, an advocate for personal responsibility and improving self-esteem in youth.


Nightingale Awards

• The mission of OU SON is to prepare transformational leaders committed to caring and using the best evidence in nursing practice, education and research to optimize the health of the public in a diverse ever-changing society.

Highlights of Outcomes

- Retention Rate for our BSN program is 95%.
- Our BSN program is one of the largest programs in Michigan. In 2021 there were a total of 432 graduates that entered the nursing workforce.
- 90% of these BSN graduates are employed upon graduation and 98% of those are employed in Michigan.





Highlights of Outcomes

Advanced Forensic Nurse-Certified (AFN-C)



Norah Lusk who resides in rural Nevada has just started her own forensic nursing business- Preziveli, LLC. Her company's mission is to provide trauma informed care and advocacy to aid the patient- victim take their first healing steps into becoming a survivor. She employs 4 nurses and 5 advocates who respond as a team for patients reporting sexual assault.

Haley Krueger had her abstract "Intimate Partner Violence Education for Outpatient Providers" accepted for a poster presentation at this Fall's International Association of Forensic Nursing Annual Conference. This was based on work Haley completed as part of her graduate project.




Unique Initiatives Diversity

- Nursing Workforce Diversity Grant: "Aspire: Achieving Success through Professionalism, Integrity, Resilience, and Engagement"
 - 4-year \$2 million nursing workforce diversity program funded by the US Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).
 - Dr. Julie Kruse Project Director
 - 25 students were accepted in this program fall 22; new cohorts accepted annually

Unique Initiatives

Holistic Admissions:

- Assesses an applicant's unique experiences alongside traditional measures of academic achievement such as grades and test scores.
- Considers a broad range of factors reflecting the applicant's academic readiness, contribution to the incoming class, and potential for success both in school and later as a professional.
- Promotes Diversity of thought in the classroom and values attributes aside grades that will contribute to student success and to the nursing profession
 - Pilot in Fall 21 and Full Initiation Fall 22
 - Collaborative effort with the University Admissions Office

Partnerships

- Outstanding Board of visitors comprised of nurse leaders, medical leaders, corporate leaders and alumni.
- Area Health System partnerships for clinical access and curricular advise. We are also working with them as advisors for their new graduate Residency programs, Research committees and Boards.


ATHLETICS ADMINISTRATION ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

 square foot driving range




ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE: ATHLETICS

Athletics Organizational Chart








